

Year 10 Battlefields Tour June 2024 Behaviour and Expectations – Code of Conduct agreement

Our expectations of students:

As a student participant, it is your responsibility to help make the trip a positive and enjoyable experience for yourself, for fellow students and for members of staff. You are expected to demonstrate high standards of conduct and accept personal responsibility for the consequences of your actions. You are expected to exhibit honesty, courtesy, consideration, cooperation and respect towards others at all times. This includes those in your group, as well as anyone else with whom you may come into contact with such as bus drivers, guides, members of the public and hotel staff. Our goal is to make this trip an educational, safe and enjoyable experience for everyone. We ask for each individual's cooperation and commitment to the following behaviour guidelines to ensure we meet this goal. It is essential that you respect the teachers, their judgments and decisions they make.

General Rules:

Students will be representing the school, community and parents at all times during the trip and will therefore, refrain from any action that will bring the school into disrepute.

Students will use appropriate language at all times and demonstrate excellent behaviour at all times.

Students are expected to participate and engage fully in all activities, which includes listening to the tour guides.

Students are to follow all instructions, which include getting to assembly points on time and the rules of each visitor attraction.

During whole group activities, students must remain with the group at all times. During free time, all students must be in a group of no less than three at all times.

Students shall not be involved in any way with smoking, alcohol, drugs, vandalism, theft, racism, bullying or any other behaviour that is judged by members of staff to be detrimental to the health, well-being or safety of him, or anyone else in the group.

Students will assume full responsibility for all valuables and personal property taken on the trip.

Students will behave with the appropriate solemnity and respect when visiting WW1 War Graves and the Menin Gate remembrance ceremony.



Travelling Rules:

Seatbelts must be worn at all times when the coach is in motion and follow all other safety instructions given by the coach driver and staff.

Music/films/games may be played on personal devices but with headphones/earphones only.

Students will avoid causing unnecessary distress or discomfort to fellow passengers.

Students will only use the areas of the ferry that are designated as safe to use by members of staff.

Students will dispose of all litter and ensure that they leave their seats clean and tidy on the coach and ferry.

Students will be responsible at certain times for taking care of their own travel documents, including their passport and GHIC card.

Lodge Rules:

Students will stay in their own room from curfew until breakfast.

No noise in rooms is expected that could disturb others after lights out.

Rooms are to be kept clean and tidy. Rooms will be checked at regular intervals. Any damage in the room must be paid for.

No student is to leave the accommodation block without the express permission of a member of staff.

Students will display considerate behaviour to other school parties staying at the Lodge.
