






























Why are we here?

What is it like in Year 10?




- GCSE's are tough!
- Students are being taught new material and skills (and in some cases new subjects altogether)
- Homework will be set each week
- Students will be expected to develop clear routines for workload and revision early on
- Some students will manage really well and others may find it hard
- Staff will be vigilant for students that may be struggling
- Teachers will be offering their time for support
- There will be a gradual, growing sense of purpose and of being a team for most students

What is on offer?

- Specialist subject teachers
- Some Period 6 sessions (full schedule in Year 11)
- Form time activities around revision/exam techniques to prepare for end of year PPEs
- Help to create, use and review revision timetables
- External organisation support sessions (Elevate)
- Access to our dedicated careers advisor (some appointments in year 10)
- Tailored individual support (mentoring etc.)
- Lunch time quiet revision in the library, after school homework support sessions




Success Criteria:

- make a link DIRECTLY to context and explain the link









- A quiet space to work

Year 11 Pre-Public Exams

Please find a link to the PPE timetable here. You were previously issued with a draft version. This has no changes from the draft version, but we wanted to confirm with you and students the timetable for revision and planning purposes.

Here is a reminder of some of the exam expectations for students:

- Students are not permitted any electronics in the exam, including wrist watches
- Students should arrive to school no later than 8.30am each day
- Students should always be in full school uniform
- Students should bring with them their full equipment including two black pens, pencil, rubber, sharpener, ruler, highlighter, protractor and scientific calculator, which must all be held in a transparent pencil case
- Students are permitted to have a drink in the exams, but this must be in a transparent bottle, containing no markings and must only be water

Year 11 Parents should have now received email confirmation of the Period 6 timetable for the week commencing 14th October and 21st October, which includes details of which sessions your son is expected to attend over the next two weeks. Attendance at their allocated sessions is compulsory so if there is any reason why your son cannot attend, please let us know in advance.

More About Work Experience

If Mr Clifton does not receive your son's pre-placement paper form before Friday 13th December, they will not have their placement health and safety checked, which may take up to 13 weeks to complete, and without this, they won't be permitted to go on Work Experience and will therefore be expected to attend school as normal during that week.

Students need to upload details from the front of the paper form, that they need to still hand in, onto an online database that they will be given access to next week, via a form tutor presentation. It is a password protected form that only allows students to upload work placements.
